## 1. PURPOSE: INSTANT IDENTITY AND CONTEXT

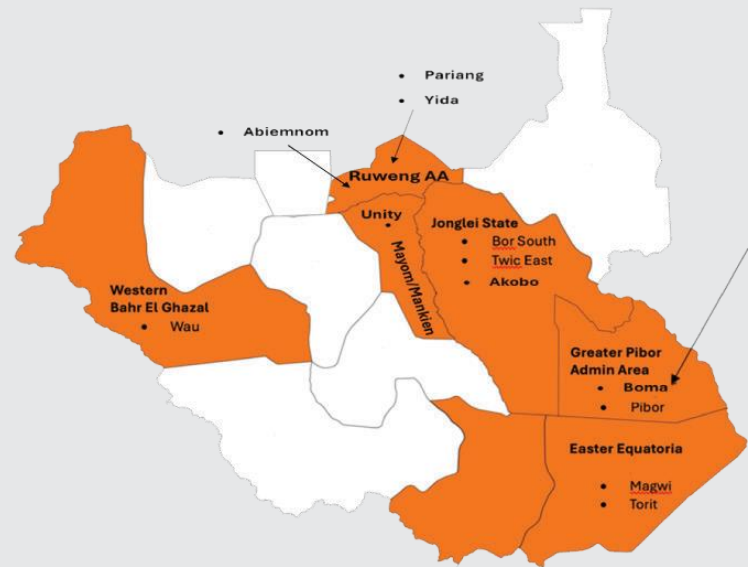
- ✓ **Period:** January – December 2025
- ✓ **Vision and Purpose:** “Our strategy spans emergency response to long-term resilience, helping communities withstand future crises.

## 2. AT-A-GLANCE OVERVIEW (KEY HIGHLIGHTS)

- ✓ **People reached (FY25):** 1,098,688, with women and girls representing 65% of all participants
- ✓ **Total programme value:** USD 11.5 million
- ✓ **Partnership model:** 8 national partners, reinforcing CARE’s commitment to localization
- ✓ **Workforce:** 97 staff, 93% national, ensuring contextual knowledge and sustainable delivery
- ✓ **Humanitarian emergencies responded to 2**
- ✓ **Women supported through core empowerment pathways:**
  - **Protection services:** 45,028 women and girls
  - **Food Security & Livelihoods:** 14,350 women

## 3. GEOGRAPHIC COVERAGE AND CONTEXT

In 2025, CARE South Sudan reached over **1.09 million people** across **4 states** and **2 administrative areas** including **Western Bahr el Ghazal, Eastern Equatoria, Central Equatoria, Jonglei, Ruweng, and Greater Pibor** delivering life-saving assistance while strengthening women’s leadership and community resilience amid conflict, displacement, and climate shocks.



## 4. STRATEGIC PRIORITIES AND THEMATIC FOCUS AREAS

- 1. **Protection and Gender in Emergencies (GiE)** - Delivered survivor-centered GBV services, psychosocial support, and protection interventions that uphold dignity, safety, and choice for women and girls
- 2. **Women, Peace and Security (WPS)** - Supported women leaders to meaningfully participate in peacebuilding, social cohesion, and community decision-making processes.

3. **Health and Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR)** - Expanded access to quality, life-saving SRHR and maternal health services for women and adolescents, particularly in hard-to-reach and crisis-affected areas.

4. **Nutrition** - Provided essential nutrition services to children and pregnant and lactating women, contributing to the prevention and treatment of malnutrition.

5. **Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL)** - Strengthened household food security and income through integrated livelihood support and resilience-focused approaches.

6. **Humanitarian Action, Partnerships and Localization** - Strengthened the capacity and leadership of 8 local partners, advancing locally led humanitarian action and sustainable service delivery.
